Ian Lee Tilmann 10/26/76 - 5/26/05



Ian Tilmann loved skateboarding and spent many hours enjoying the sport. He loved feeling the wind surrounding him as he sped downhill carving each and every curve of the road beneath him. He was fearless with a strong belief in enjoying life to its fullest. He was a street surfer....his passion was Longboarding.

On the evening of May 16, 2005, Ian and several friends were skateboarding down Hercules Ave. in Clearwater, FL on a run known locally as Cemetery Hill. As he was making his last run down the hill that evening his skateboard locked up on a "wheel bite" and he was thrown headfirst onto the pavement. Ian was <u>NOT</u> wearing a helmet and as a result he suffered severe Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBI). Ian never regained consciousness and died 10 days later on May 26, 2005. Our beloved son was 28

years old. When people hear lan's story many ask with shock and disbelief "he died from falling off a skateboard"? Ian's Mom, Dad and family were devastated by lan's death and the inevitable question; Why did this happen? Would a helmet have saved lan's life that fateful night?

The answer to that question and how lan's Mom. Marcy Tilmann resolved the issue is shared on our website in Ian Tilmann's Story by Roxanne Wilder of Catch 47 TV Tampa Florida. This heartfelt report is an excellent introduction to Marcy Tilmann, the Mom who decided to reach all Skaters with lan's message. Ian was musically talented and he played brass horns in Countryside High School March Band and the Suncoast Sound Drum and Bugle Corps, Ian was a US Marine and joined upon turning 18. After serving 4 years Ian received an Honorable Discharge and returned to civilian life to pursue his dreams cut short by a tragic Life Decision.

"Old School" Skaters creating a movement and positive force in the world of Skateboarding. Skaters of all ages including "Old School" Skaters (over 30), Longboarders, Street Skaters, Bowl. Vert and Skate Park Riders who always wear helmets are signing up to join Helmet **Nation** TM. We are building a mass movement of Skaters who choose to always wear helmets and encourage others to do the same. Those Skaters who join **Helmet Nation** TM help reach Skaters who need a helmet but can not afford the \$40-60 to buy one. Skaters can receive a FREE helmet if they Promise to wear it every time they Skate. The **Helmet for a Promise** 18 program will provide a FREE a custom ordered Skaters helmet if they Promise to wear it every time they Skate.

Helmet Nation ™ is an OPT-IN movement of Skaters who choose to wear helmets whenever they Skate. Helmet Nation seeks commitment to promote Skating "Smart" knowing full well there is nothing safe about action sports and Skateboarding in particular. Many Skaters know the truth because they have been there, fallen many times as they became Masters of the sport. Most Skaters are in total denial about the risks of TBI and typically disdain helmets. The fact is in 2009, over 23,114 head injuries were treated in Emergency Rooms nationwide from Skateboarding TBI, an average of 3 Skaters per hour 24/7. **Helmet Nation** TM members know the facts and make the smart choice to wear a helmet whenever they Skate. There is only one proven cure for Traumatic Brain Injury....it is called PREVENTION!

Helmet for a PromiseTM is an OPT-IN Free Helmet program for Skaters who do not own a helmet and can not afford to buy one. The Helmet for a PromiseTM approach is simple and direct. If a Skater will Promise to wear the helmet whenever they Skate, they receive a custom ordered helmet for FREE. Helmets offered include top Skate brands such as S-ONE and Bern in a wide range of styles and colors. Each Skater gets to choose their helmet style

and color, which is sized to fit properly. **Helmet for a Promise** TM requires a form Registration completed with the required information and a signed Promise. The Registrations for Free Helmets are released as funds become available. Skaters are asked to OTP-IN to the email registry that forms Helmet Nation. Once a Skater joins Helmet Nation and receives the helmet, we continue to stoke Skaters and their crews to Pay it Forward and spread the word on the Streets and Skate Parks about our program.

Skate Parks

The Foundation works with local Skate Parks and "Old School" Skaters as co-hosts for Skate Contests. Our Sponsors support these events with prizes, Skate Pros and Skate product for raffle prizes. The Skate events typically raise adequate funds to pay the cost of the helmets Promised at the event. Since 2005, we have cosponsored over 65 events placing 1,000's helmets. We ask Old School Skaters to step up for helmets, work for the benefit of all Skaters and start a **Helmet for a Promise** TM program in their community.

The Ian Tilmann Foundation, Inc. was incorporated in November 2005 as a Florida Non-Profit corporation. The Foundation is certified as a Public Charity under the Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(3) with Florida Tax Exemption.


